- Document and communicate to stakeholders the nature of the character we want to preserve
- Work with the City, neighborhood groups, local businesses, and the public to build consensus on a description of Union Square's character using survey data and other input as appropriate; explicitly include diversity of business ownership to ensure inclusion of People of Color (POC) and Black and Indigenous POC

RELIABLE MARKET

Reliable Market has been a long time beacon of diversity in Union Square. As the area has evolved, so has the market by expanding its offerings from just groceries to craft beers, home goods & prepared foods. A visit here can take you on many culinary adventures. Visit Reliable Market & the many other diverse international markets in Union to try your hand at a dish you've never made before.

Try out a recipe inspired by Reliable Market's family favorite, Kimchi Pancakes.

In the spirit of their Korean roots, sharing food is sharing love.

KIMCHI PANCAKES

Ingredients*

- ½ Ib well-fermented napa cabbage kimchi, chopped into small pieces, plus 2 tbsp of the brine
- · 3 scallions, chopped
- · ½ tsp sugar
- · 1/2 c all-purpose flour
- ½ c water
- · 4 tbsp vegetable oil

Directions

- Combine kimchi, brine, scallions, sugar, flour, and water in a medium bowl and mix well with a spoon
- Heat a 12-in nonstick skillet over medium heat. (If you don't have a 12-in skillet, use a smaller skillet to make 2 pancakes)
- Add 2 tbsp vegetable oil and swirl to coat the bottom of the pan
- Pour batter into pan and spread with the back of a spoon or a spatula to make a large circle
- Cook until the bottom is golden brown and crisp, 3-5 min
- Carefully turn pancake over. Drizzle the remaining 2 tbsp oil around the edges of skillet, then lift pancake with a thin spatula to allow oil to run underneath and tilt pan to spread it evenly
- Cook until the bottom of the pancake is light golden brown and crisp, 3-5 min
- · Flip pancake one more time and cook for another min
- Slide onto a large serving platter and serve immediately

ARPA: American Rescue Plan Act—legislation passed by Congress providing economic relief to address impacts of the pandemic

The goal?

Learn what business model a nonprofit like ours can have that would best serve your favorite Square businesses and your rapidly-developing neighborhood

What do we know so far?

After chatting with more than 500 Union Square community members for our most recent strategic plan, we learned that folx deeply #LoveUnionSquare and feel protecting the character and connectivity of your community is more critical than ever during this immense period of transformation.

Your priorities included:



Multilingual wayfinding to make Union Square more welcoming, attractive and increase its walkability



Increased community connections with local businesses to strengthen your neighborhood's resilience and pandemic recovery



Enhanced collaboration with nonprofit partners dedicated to equitable economic opportunity to enable us to serve more vulnerable members of our community

Your feedback has driven USMS to expand the impact of our equitable, place-keeping, and partnership-focused programs.

Thank you for helping co-create USMS' future service to Union Square

There are many types of business models that USMS could grow into to offer these services, but based on your feedback so far, the best fit *might* be a **Business Improvement District (BID)**

What is a BID?

BID: Business Improvement District

A dynamic partnership between community, property owners, and businesses to bolster the economic and social vitality of a neighborhood through supplemental services

The focus of Keeping Small Strong is supporting **small businesses** disproportionately impacted by the pandemic

BIDs provide a unified voice on issues that are important to the neighborhood and are specific to the needs of that community

This is important because we can stay uniquely Union.

BIDs have been proven to help increase the speed of sustainable recovery for small businesses impacted by

the pandemic

Did you know...

There are many BIDs in
Massachusetts! Some
examples include Central
Square, Downtown Boston,
Amherst, Springfield,
Hyannis, Worcester, Hudson
and Boston Greenway

So what does this have to do with Keeping Small Strong?

Keeping Small Strong gives the neighborhood the ability to "try out" some of the services a BID would provide while we learn alongside each other if it's the right fit


